2001: Time for Delivery

The year 2000 provided us with the opportunity to reflect on our HIV/AIDS interventions and plan for the future. Some of the important achievements in this regard were the development of the *HIV/AIDS/STD Strategic Plan for South Africa, 2000-2005*. From that strategic framework we have:

- ⌘ Hosted sectoral summits to popularise the Strategic Plan
- ⌘ Launched nine HIV/AIDS related guidelines, including the treatment of opportunistic infections
- ⌘ Developed a framework for the implementation of the MTCT programme in all nine provinces
- ⌘ Developed business plans relating to Home-Based Care, Voluntary Counselling and Testing, and Life Skills Education as part of the Integrated Plan for Children Infected and Affected by HIV/AIDS (2000 – 2003).
- ⌘ Finalised negotiations with Pfizer on the Diflucan programme to provide

Fluconazole to HIV/AIDS patients with cryptococcal meningitis and oesophageal candidiasis.

2001 now marks the time for delivery on these plans developed in 2000. All of these programmes are due for implementation within the next 3 months. This is a very exciting development, as it provides for an opportunity to make a real meaningful intervention into the lives of people living with HIV/AIDS. Minister Manto Tshabalala-Msimang clearly stated that we need to shift our emphasis from prevention activities only, and focus much more on care and support programmes. These programmes allow us to deliver on that instruction.
