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Analysing the PHC Package Gap

One of the priorities of the DOH is to ensure that the full package of PHC services is available to all the population. As shown in Table 33 of *Part C: Preparing Annual Reports*, districts are required to report on the percentage of fixed public PHC facilities offering the full package of PHC services. This is done by checking each facility against a list of the service included in the package, such as the one shown in Table 8. The number of facilities that provide all the services is calculated as a percentage of the total number of facilities.

It is also important to show which services are **not** provided. This can be done by showing what percentage of facilities do not provide a particular service. For example, the report could say that 15% of the clinics do not provide HIV testing and counselling.
